1/ AI in Action: transforming support roles in sixth form colleges

This workshop explores how Generative Artificial Intelligence (GenAI) can enhance the role of support staff in a sixth form college setting. We will examine practical AI tools that can streamline administrative tasks, improve communication, and support student wellbeing. Participants will gain insights into how GenAI can assist with reducing workload while improving efficiency.
